



## MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

HELD ON THURSDAY, 4<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST, 2016  
 AT THE EVANGEL ASSEMBLIES OF GOD, ADABRAKA

### 1.0 OPENING & DEVOTION

The meeting started at 1:20 p.m and the General Secretary, Rev. Erasmus Odonkor, said the opening prayer. He invited the President of the Bible Society of Ghana, Most Rev. Prof. Emmanuel K. Asante, to lead the devotion after Hymn 50 of the Asempra Hymnal was sung.

### 1.1 Exhortation

Most Rev. Prof. Emmanuel Asante led the devotion based on the Scripture passages in Matthew 22:15 – 22 and Romans 13:1 – 7. In the first passage, the Pharisees in their attempt to have Jesus politically implicated, entered into an alliance with the Herodians, a political party that supported Herod Antipas and policies instituted by Rome in order to trap Jesus. They asked Jesus about paying taxes to Rome. The question was designed to force Jesus to take sides on a politically controversial subject. If Jesus agreed that it was right to pay taxes to Caesar, the Pharisees would accuse him of identifying with Caesar in opposition to God, the only King the Jews recognized. If Jesus said they should not pay taxes to Caesar, the Herodians would hand Him over to Herod on the charge of sedition and rebellion. Jesus tactfully dealt with the issue without taking sides from His answer in Matthew 22:21: "Give unto Caesar what is ....."

Most Rev. Prof Asante noted that Jesus pointed to our dual citizenship as Christians (1 Peter 2:17) and said our citizenship in the Kingdom of God placed on us certain civic responsibilities as follows:

- i. That we contribute actively to the development of the nation.
- ii. That we pay taxes for the services/benefits we receive.
- iii. That we pledge to God our ultimate obedience and commitment.

He observed that the Church as a body could not remain aloof from political life; hide under the cloak of neutrality and shun delicate social and political issues. He quoted one of the greatest Christian thinkers, Vincent Taylor's words: "The Church must be rooted in the Society in which it has grown up, its members are a part of that Society, sharing its traditional points of view influenced by its past history; and involved in its strength and weakness, its rise or fall. When a Church cuts itself off from the rest of Society and lives in isolation from Society, it becomes irrelevant, alienated and separated. Such a Church becomes paralyzed altogether".

Most Rev. Prof. Asante referred to Romans 13:1–7 and noted that the following four points should be observed:

- i. **All authority comes from God** (Romans 13:1).

- ii. **All authentic governments are subordinate to God and His laws** (Romans 13:4). Those who rule must beware of totalitarian government of the beast described in Revelation 13. The Church should hold traditional and civil governments' attention to God because the State is God's servant and politics is for the good of the people and to restrain evil from Society.

- iii. **Authority is an avenue for service**

Authority is the social channel for the realization of divine norms into actions. Our authorities must be prepared to serve rather than gain power for us to serve them.

- iv. **The State exists to promote justice**

Justice is a condition for the harmonious living among its people. Society is to be so ordered that justice will not be compromised.

In conclusion, Most Rev. Prof. Asante admonished Christians that we have a responsibility to keep an eye on the Society; and not to allow our ethnic and political affiliation to blind us to the political activities of our country. Our perspective is our commitment to the Word of God, what it says and how we can impact and develop the Society. He prayed to end the devotion.

### 5.0 ADOPTION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

The minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting held on Thursday, 6th August, 2015 were taken as read. The following corrections were made:

Page 1 – Item 3.2: Rev. Emmanuel Tumfour - Evangelical Presbyterian Church, Ghana

Page 2 – Item 8, Third paragraph: The sentence “**The decision was unanimously accepted by the meeting**” was moved to the end of the paragraph as the last sentence.

In the absence of further corrections, the General Secretary moved for the acceptance of the minutes for discussion. The motion was seconded by Lay Pastor Emmanuel Quaye.

### 6.0 MATTERS ARISING

#### 6.1 BSG Golden Jubilee Celebration

The General Secretary informed the meeting that details of the celebration had been covered in his annual report and gave the highlights as follows:

- The Jubilee celebration was launched by H.E Kwesi Amissah-Arthur, Vice President of the Republic of Ghana, on 8th

February, 2015 at the Pentecost International Worship Centre, Kwabenya.

- Jubilee Exhibition from 13th to 17th April 2015 at the Bible House.
- Anniversary Celebrations in the Regions
- Golden Jubilee Thanksgiving Service on Sunday, 27th September, 2015 at the Accra International Conference Centre.

The General Secretary commended the Anniversary Coordinator, Mrs Catherine Odjidja and the Planning Committee for the work they did and expressed gratitude to them and all who contributed to the success of the celebration.

He informed members that the new BSG cloth was available for sale.

#### 6.2 The Bible Village Project, Kitase

The project was covered in the General Secretary's report.

### 7.0 PRESENTATION OF 2015 ANNUAL REPORT

Before presenting his report, the General Secretary expressed gratitude to God, Council members, all Standing Committees and members of the Society for their donations and support. He also expressed gratitude and appreciation for the support from the Churches, donors and partners of the Society, He also acknowledged the hard work of members of staff.

He reported on the following thematic areas:

- Governance
- Management and Staff
- Translation
- Bible Distribution
- Church Relations
- Bible Engagement Programmes and Bible Advocacy
- Promotions and Resource Mobilization
- Youth and Bible Work
- BSG Golden Jubilee Celebration
- Other Activities/Matters

After the presentation of the 2015 annual report, Rev. Erasmus Odonkor moved for its adoption. The motion was seconded by Mr. Samuel Owusu Yeboah.

#### 7.1 Comments/Concerns on 2015 Annual Report

- i. A member suggested that the Representatives of Local Council of Churches should be allowed to register members of Churches for the Bible Society of Ghana. The General Secretary noted that the Local Council of Churches support Bible work by encouraging all the churches in their jurisdictions to promote Bible work; but that they also do many other activities and programmes in the church and therefore BSG could not burden or monopolize them. Another member suggested that details of the Society's projects should be made available so that members can support them. The General Secretary indicated that the key project of the BSG was the Kitase Bible Village and appealed to members to bring ideas, suggestions and strategies as to how members could support to complete it. He added that there was the need to complete the project quickly so that the BSG could host the World Assembly of the United Bible Societies in the next few years, otherwise so much money would be spent on hotels and BSG would lose out on revenue.
- ii. A member talked about the absence of the Salvation Army's representation on Council although the church participates in Bible Week and makes contributions. He expressed his willingness to undertake Bible distribution in Cape Coast. The General Secretary explained that appointment onto Council

was by election and encouraged all Churches to register as BSG members so that they could vote during the elections. He added that BSG welcomed and worked with all Churches and all Christians. The General Secretary encouraged the member to visit the Distribution Department to discuss the distribution of Bibles.

- iii. The newly appointed member of Council suggested that people outside the membership of the BSG who had some extra money to spare and were willing to loan money without interest could be approached. He said it was possible to get people who would be prepared to support in this way because it had worked in certain cases. The General Secretary thanked him for the suggestion and noted it for further discussion.
- iv. On the question of how members could make donations without always having to go the BSG offices, the General Secretary referred the meeting to various options that were available on page 19 of AGM brochure.
  - A call to BSG offices to pick the donation (Telephone numbers on page 19)
  - Mobile money (details on page 53 of booklet)
  - Make cheques and postal orders by post
  - Bank deposits (BSG bank account numbers on page 19)

The General Secretary noted that it was important to write the full name of the donor in the depositor's name space even if it was someone else making the deposit.

- v. A member made reference to item 8a (Membership) of the 2015 Annual report on page 12 and requested to have an indication of what changes a member's status from active to inactive. The General Secretary explained that if the computer did not capture a donor's name for three consecutive years, the system automatically moved his/her name to inactive status. However, members were prompted annually and the office would call and follow up on them when necessary. He appealed to members to make a contribution to Bible work annually.

**8.0 PRESENTATION OF 2015 AUDITED ACCOUNTS**

Mr. Alvin K. Attayi, a representative of O.A.K. Chartered Accountants, Auditors of the Society, presented the Financial Statement for the year ended 31st December, 2015 on pages 23 to 26 of the AGM brochure.

Mr. Attayi expressed the opinion of the Auditors saying *“the accompanying financial statements of the Bible Society of Ghana give a true and fair view of the state of the financial affairs of the Society as at 31 December, 2015 and of the results and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards....., and comply with the Companies Act 1963 (Act 179)”*.

After the presentation, Rev. Erasmus Odonkor moved for the acceptance of the 2015 Audited Accounts for discussion. The motion was seconded by Rev. Isaac Ollennu. In the absence of any questions on the audited accounts, the General Secretary moved for its adoption. The meeting unanimously adopted the Auditor's report.

**9.0 RE-APPOINTMENT OF AUDITORS**

The Chairman of the BSG Business Committee, Mr. Sam Otu-Boateng, moved for the re-appointment of O.A.K. Chartered Accountants as Auditors of the Society for the 2016 financial year. The motion was seconded by Rt. Rev. Emmanuel Afriyie.

**10.0 THE BIBLE VILLAGE PROJECT**

The General Secretary informed the meeting that as part of the BSG's Golden Jubilee celebrations, the sod was cut on 27th April 2015 to commence the construction of a Bible Retreat Centre (The Bible Village) at Kitase, near Peduase in the Eastern Region. The land for the project was donated to BSG by Intercessors for Africa. The General Secretary expressed the Society's sincerest gratitude to Madam Regina Addae and children, the original owners of the land, who donated it first to Intercessors for Africa; and also to Intercessors for Africa for their donation to BSG.

He reported that the first of the buildings to be constructed on the project site was almost completed. He informed the meeting of the proposal (for the Kitase Project to be completed on time) that within the next one year by July 2017, every member should make a special Kitase contribution of at least GH100.00 and that a special register would be opened for it.

The proposal was unanimously accepted by the meeting. The General Secretary thanked members and encouraged them to visit the project site to see what God was doing through their decision to support.

**11.0 ELECTION TO NATIONAL COUNCIL AND RECONSTITUTION OF BSG COMMITTEES**

The General Secretary informed the meeting that Council met and appointed new Officers to replace Most Rev. Prof Asante and Prof. Ibok Oduro (outgoing President and 2nd Vice President respectively) as follows:

On his own behalf and on behalf of the members of Council whose term of office had ended, Most Rev. Prof. Asante expressed gratitude to colleague Council members. He said it had been so good working together in the Lord's vineyard and promoting the work of God. He also thanked all members of the Bible Society of Ghana for their prayers and support and the cooperation they had exhibited in all the meetings. He congratulated the General Secretary for his hard work and humility and also congratulated him for earning a doctoral degree.

Most Rev. Prof. Asante said that members of the Bible Society should be proud that in Ghana we have the Bible Society to mediate the Word of God to them in their language and should support the BSG by making a financial commitment anytime they got up and read their Bible. He urged members to support the Kitase Bible Village Project which would not only bring income for Bible work but also produce a place that they could go and do reflection, meditation and think about the Word of God. He said members should not just think about giving GH¢100.00 but mobilize money to ensure that the project did not stall.



## 17.0 VOTE OF THANKS


